What is AlloSure?



AlloSure helps your nephrologist monitor the health of your new kidney



This simple blood test is more accurate than traditional tests like serum creatinine



AlloSure measures a biomarker in your blood called donor-derived cell-free DNA (dd-cfDNA)



When dd-cfDNA increases, it provides your doctor with an early warning that there may be an issue with your kidney

Questions to ask your doctor:

- ? What makes AlloSure better than serum creatinine alone?
- ? How would AlloSure fit into my post-transplant care plan?
- ? What do my results mean?
- ? How often would I get an AlloSure test?
- ? When would I need a biopsy?
- ? Is AlloSure covered by my insurance?
- ? Is there someone I can reach out to for support?



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AlloSure is a covered benefit by Medicare and as well as other types of insurance.
